She is a coordinator of the educational website *Learning and Teaching with the Web* <u>http://titova.ffl.msu.ru</u> which was set up in 2001. The site was designed for both our teachers and our students. It aims at facilitating the process of implementing web resources and tools into learning and teaching experience, students can find here helpful online tests, syllabi, samples of the best web projects, web activities and research papers. It keeps teachers up to date with the latest developments in e-learning and mobile learning.

She is a material developer and a tutor of online professional development courses *ICT Integration* in Language Classroom Course and Mobile Technologies in Education <u>http://titova.ffl.msu.ru/online-courses.html</u>; a coordinator of a pilot project Webinars in Education <u>http://titova.ffl.msu.ru/for-teachers/webinars.html</u>. The main aim of this project is to provide online webinars in history, literature, culture studies and languages for our students and professional development webinars for teachers specializing in Web 2.0 integration ( blogs, wikis, e-portfolio tools) into language classroom.

In 2011 Titova S. initiated foundation of Interactive Technologies Center. The main activity of the Center is focused on finding solutions to different methodical problems connected to interactive methods and cloud-, smart- and mobile- technologies based tasks. Titova S. is the coordinator of 2 projects: Webinars as a special form of interactive teaching <u>http://webinar.ffl.msu.ru</u> and Mobile technologies in foreign language teaching: theory and practice.

Titova S. teaches the following courses: Introduction to FL Teaching, ICT in Society and Politics, The U.S. by Regions, Socio-political and Cultural Identity of the US Regions for students in the 3,4 and 5 years in Department of Linguistics and International Communication and Regional Studies, "ICT in Research and Teaching" for postgraduate students of the Faculty of Foreign Languages and Region Studies. The Average annual number of academic hours- 243,2 hours.

Titova S. is in charge of Professional development courses. She developed and launched online professional development courses for foreign language teachers <u>http://ikt.ffl.msu.ru</u> for professional de skills improvement of school and high school teachers "ICT in FLT" (72 hours), "Mobile Technologies in FLT" (72 hours). In 2015 S. Titova with colleagues developed and started to pilot an online Professional Development course "ICT in FLT" (670 hours).

She coordinates a new long-term research project of LMSU - *Mobile devices in Language Classroom: theory and practice <u>http://titova.ffl.msu.ru/for-teachers/our-project.html</u> which was launched in 2011. This project includes several stages such as evaluating of students' preparedness to implement mobile technologies and teaching staff mobile competences and skills; setting up a moblog for educators devoted to mobile teaching experience; working out the syllabus for a online education professional development course for foreign language teachers <i>Mobile technologies in Language Classroom;* piloting this course; working out ways to deliver mobile content to our students - (mobile grammar and vocabulary tests, tasks based on mobile reference apps) and to get immediate feedback from the students at lecture courses via Student Response Student www.histproject.no, designing and launching our own specialty educational grammar/vocabulary apps; creating a mobile version of educational web resources site.
